

## **Placement Test**

Do you have previous knowledge of German? If you do, you are required to take a PLACEMENT TEST that will allow us to determine the best place for you to start studying German at the U of T. Depending on your level of proficiency - perhaps you have lived or studied in Germany, have spoken some German at home, or taken high school German - you may be able to place out of introductory courses and begin taking intermediate and advanced language, literature, and culture offerings right away. This will not only allow you to get the most out of your university studies, but help our instructors to focus on students who are learning German from scratch. \*You must take the placement test if you have had previous exposure to German.\*
