GER 275HS - MARX, NIETZSCHE, FREUD

QUALIFICATIONS:

A background in German Studies and familiarity with the German Undergraduate Program are required. Preference will be given to candidates with a demonstrated expertise in: (a) German culture, including areas like literature, music, film and architecture; (b) German philosophy and history of thought.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This is an introductory course to the thought of Karl Marx, Friedrich Nietzsche, and Sigmund Freud and their pioneering contributions to the understanding of the individual and society in modernity. Readings include selections from writings of the early Marx, the Communist Manifesto, and Capital, Nietzsche's critique of culture, academe, and nationalism, and Freud's theory of culture, his views on the psychopathology of everyday life, on the meaning of dreams, symptoms, the return of the repressed, and what it might mean to live in a free society.

DUTIES INCLUDE:

Attendance of lectures (Tuesdays 3-5pm) / Grading of assignments such as final exam, evaluation of oral presentations, essays and quizzes / Web component supervision / Communicating with instructor.
