GER 150HS – INTRODUCTION TO GERMAN CULTURE

QUALIFICATIONS:

A background in German Studies and familiarity with the German Undergraduate Program are required. Preference will be given to candidates with a demonstrated expertise in: German culture, including areas like literature, history, music, film and architecture, and history of thought.

RELEVANT CRITERION:

Previous experience is the more relevant criterion than the need to acquire experience in respect of this posted position.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course will introduce students to German culture through a variety of texts, images, films, and discourses. Throughout the course, we will interrogate certain notions of what constitutes culture in a German historical context while gaining an understanding of events that have influenced Germany from 1871 to the present.

DUTIES INCLUDE:

Grading of assignments such as midterm essays, final exam, meeting and communicating with instructor.
