



How to recycle in Freiburg

In Freiburg, recycling is generally done using a system of colored bins and community collection points. Household waste is typically sorted into a blue bin for paper and cardboard, a yellow or orange bin for plastic and metal packaging with the *Grüner Punkt* logo, a brown bin for bio waste, and a grey bin for non-recyclable trash. Glass containers are also recycled separately by color in designated community bins.

Here's a more detailed breakdown:

- 1. Blue Bin (blaue Tonne):
 - For paper and cardboard waste.
 - Flatten cardboard boxes before placing them in the bin.
 - No plastic bags allowed in the blue bin.
- 2. Yellow/Orange Bin (Wertstofftonne):
 - For plastic and metal containers, including those with the Grüner Punkt logo.
 - Items with the Grüner Punkt symbol indicate the manufacturer has paid for recycling.
- 3. Brown Bin (Biomüll):
 - For biodegradable waste like food scraps and garden waste.
 - Use paper bags, not plastic or biodegradable bags.
- 4. Grey Bin (Restmüll):
 - For any waste that cannot be recycled.
- 5. Glass Recycling (Glasiglus):
 - Community bins for glass containers, sorted by color (brown for brown glass, green for green/red/blue glass, and white for transparent glass).
 - Some communities do not require cleaning glass containers before recycling.

- 6. Deposit System (Pfandsystem):
 - For certain types of reusable bottles (beer, mineral water, etc.), there is a deposit that is returned when the bottle is returned to a designated station.

7. Community Collection Points:

• Freiburg has numerous community collection points for recycling, including glass bins, textile bins, and other specialized bins for specific materials.

8. Waste Calendar:

• Residents receive a waste calendar outlining collection schedules for different types of waste.
